Minutes of the meeting for finalization of the Annual calendar for Training and Competition (ACTC) for the discipline of Wushu for 2025-26.

A meeting to finalize the Annual Calendar for Training and Competition (ACTC) for Wushu for 2025-26 was held on 24th March 2025 at 12.30PMunder the Chairpersonship of Smt. Sujata Chaturvedi, Secretary (Sports) MYA&S at the Conference Hall, Sports Authority of India HQ, New Delhi. The list of participants is **annexed**.

2. Presentation by NSF

WAI presented a plan for holding the National Coaching Camps, Foreign Exposures, along with the components requiring financial support, to prepare for various international competitions during 2025-26. (Details annexed)

3. Commitment by Wushu Association of India (WAI)

Secretary General, WAI, made the following commitments, which were included as binding decisions as a part of approved ACTC calendar and budget:

- 3.1 A target for 06 medals in the 2026 Asian Games through implementing a continuous selection process supported by a decentralized system across three centers.
- 3.2 A more focused and targeted Junior Development Programme with a defined expenditure ratio for Senior and Junior age groups as presented in the ACTC proposal.
- 3.3 Budgeting to be done to ensure equal expenditure for Men and Women categories.
- 3.4 Strengthening and capacity building in National Camps through inclusion of Sports Science Staff and ensuring scientific evaluation of campers and targeted interventions thereof.
- 3.5 Displaying of grants received through the ANSFs scheme onthe website of WAI.
- 3.6 Strict compliance of WADA Code and NADA rules, details of educational plans for athletes and display of Anti-Doping awareness programmes on their respective websites, competitions venues, Training venues, social media platforms etc.

Approval of ACTC proposal

The calendar and detailed proposal submitted by WAI were reviewed and approved. The total approved budget under the ANSFs scheme for FY 2025-26 towards WAI shall be **Rs.5.00 Crore** as per the latest ANSFs norms of MYA&S dated 28th February 2022.

Compliance with Court Directions

The disbursement of funds under the ANSFs scheme will be subject to the directions issued by the Hon'ble Delhi High Court in WP (C) No. 8691/2020, Rahul Mehra vs Union of India. A review would be undertaken in the month of **October-November 2025**, based on the progress, achievements and targeted preparation for Asian Games 2026, for any additional requirement of funds subject to availability of budget under the 'Assistance to NSF' scheme.

6. Modifications to the calendar can be made by the NSF with the approval of DG SAI within the overall approved budget. It is reiterated that all the guidelines mentioned in the MYAS circular dated 28th February 2022, along with the modifications in the norms, will be adhered to.

Key directives from Secretary (Sports) Secretary (Sports) emphasised the following aspects:

- a. Strict compliance to the various circulars and guidelines issued by MYA&S and SAI regarding governance and financial assistance.
- b. Strict compliance to the MYA&S circular dated 31.10.2016 regarding suomoto disclose, on its website about the details of various activities carried out by the WAI.
- c. Strict adherence to the selection guidelines issued by MYAS vide letter no. 12-2/2025-SP-III, dated 05th March, 2025.
- d. Decline in the number of medals in the recent Asian Games compared to the 2018 Asian Games, as few medal-probable athletes from Arunachal Pradesh missed participation due to Visa issues. The Secretary (Sports) stated that our Athletes should never go on stapled visas to China.
- e. Selection policy should clearly define the criteria for the upcoming international competitions till Asian games 2026 and it is to be uploaded on their official website as per the latest guidelines issued by MYAS.

- f. NSF to ensure the presence of the Chief Coach during the conduct of National Coaching Camps.
- g. Prepare the roadmap for the Asian Games 2026 and Youth Olympic 2026with detailed training plan which includes strengthening of junior development programme under NCOE, robust domestic competition structure in lines with best practices in the world, Coach development plan, Athlete education, Grass root development plan etc.
- h. Training and Competitions for athletes should cater for adequate recovery and peaking at the right time to ensure maximum medal probability.
- i. The meeting ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
